



The next morning Sarah was walking to school when she saw Ben. "Ben," she shouted. "I had a really strange dream last night."


"Me too," said Ben. "But tell me your dream first."


Glossary

"Please help us!"


"I'll have to talk to the other dwarves. Come, follow me," he said as he opened a door in the rock.

"Please," Sarah said, "it is very important. We must see the Lord of Tears."


"Then you must give us something," said Tom. "Have you got any gold or silver?"






